

Content guidelines

Article size

Text length is negotiable, with a guide being:

- 1000 – 2000 words for a feature article
- 300 – 500 words for a short article or technical note

Articles are to be emailed directly to the editorial team as a Word document.

Article Tone

Stories must be well balanced – we don't publish advertorial-style pieces. Articles should be written in language that isn't overly technical. Authors can assume that the readership has some knowledge of the subject area, but shouldn't assume expert knowledge.

Tables

Tables can be provided in the text as a guide, however where appropriate, table data should be provided in a separate file.

Images

Photos, graphs and diagrams are welcomed for each article. These will be included at the discretion of the editorial team according to space, quality and capacity to enhance the article.

- Images should be supplied as high-resolution electronic files in JPG format. A file size of at least 500KB is required.
 - Figures and tables should be sent as editable files or raw data (*Remediation Australasia* will not in any way manipulate the data, but reserves the right to reformat for style).
 - Authors must obtain permission to use photographs of sites, people and specialised equipment before submission for publication in *Remediation Australasia*, and must provide the name of the photographer or organisation to whom the photo belongs for attribution.
 - Photos, graphs and diagrams must be sent as separate files (not embedded in a word document).
 - Captions for illustrations are essential; the author should indicate where images are to be located.

Deadlines

Articles should be submitted for consideration by the 15th of the month, two months prior (roughly 6 working weeks prior in total) to the publication release.
